In the name of God Amen I William Phylbie of Postcombe in the County of Oxford ploughmaker being sicke in bodie and ofand perfect memory praise be to God doe make and ordaine this my last will and testament this thirteenth day of March in the year of Lord God 1597 In the manner and form folowing First I bequeath my soule in the hands of almightie god as to the right owner thereof who maketh his only begotten sonne Jesus Christ to redeem me and all mankynde most Passion I fully and stedfastlyto be Secondly my bodie to be buried in the parish church yarde of Lewknor First I bequeath unto Robert Phylbie my sonne one milk cow then I bequeath unto William Phylbie my sonne one cowe then I bequeath unto John Phylbie my sonne one cowe then I bequeath unto Rachall Phylbie my daughter one browne horse then I bequeath unto Alice Phylbie my daughter one black also I give untomy children my ... of the..... and fixed of lying and being in the parish of Adwell to be equally divided amongst them at the discretion of my overseers of this my last will And I bequeath unto Robart Phylbie and unto William Phylbie my sonnes the house of mydwellingnot all the appurtenances after the decease of my wife Ance Phylbie in consideration of the bringing up of the rest of my children Item I bequeath unto my wife Agnce Phylbie all the goods and chattels not given unto me by the last will and testament of Antony Smith brother unto my wife Agnce Phylbie All the rest of my goods moveable and immoveable my debts being payed and fulfilled I give unto Ane Phylbie my wifeI do make my full and executrix of this my last will and testament paying above mentioned unto my children the overseer of this my last will I make and ordaine John and in the presence of Jhon and
