Will of Edward Filbe of Reymersstone in the
 County of Norfolk Esquire an though somewhat
 indisposed in Body yet of a perfect memory and
 understanding and considering the uncertainty of this
 life I do make and publish my last Will and Testament
 in manner following First I give and devise all and
 every my Messuages Lands Tenements and Hereditaments
 whatsoever situate lying and being in ^{Reymersstone} Reymersstone
 aforesaid and in Plumpton or elsewhere in the said County
 of Norfolk as well Freehold as Copyhold with their and
 every of their Appurtenances unto my ⁽¹⁾ Nephew
 Edward Filbe and to his heirs forever, charged and charged
 with the payment of the several Legacies and sum of
 Money hereinafter by me given Also I give and
 bequeath unto my ⁽²⁾ Nephew William Filbe the
 sum of one hundred pounds of lawful Money of Great
 Britain Also I give and bequeath unto my ⁽³⁾ Nephews
 and Nieces John Clark, ⁽⁴⁾ Francis Clark, ⁽⁵⁾ Myris Clark,
⁽⁶⁾ William Clark, ⁽⁷⁾ Mary the wife of Alexander Pain,
⁽⁸⁾ Martha Clark, ⁽⁹⁾ John Grimmer, ⁽¹⁰⁾ Robert Grimmer
⁽¹¹⁾ Bridget Reynor widow, and to ⁽¹²⁾ Jane Pain my
 Cousin Cooper (in case she lives with me at my decease
 and not otherwise) and to each and every one of them
 the sum of ten pounds ^{£10} apiece of like lawful Money.
 All which said several Legacies to the said William
 Filbe, John Clark, Francis Clark, Myris Clark, William
 Clark, Mary Pain, Martha Clark, John
 Grimmer, Robert Grimmer, Bridget Reynor, and
 Jane Pain my will and mind is and I do hereby
 direct that the same shall be paid within the space
 of twelve ^{thirty and} Calendar months next after my decease
 and I do hereby subject my said Messuages Lands
 Tenements and Hereditaments to and with the payment
 of all and every the aforesaid Legacies and sum of Money
 and

With a proper Inscription thereon to perpetuate
our Memorys and two other Gravens or set thereon
at the top thereof and as I when in health used to take
much pleasure in keeping and looking after my little
flock of sheep which have been very profitable to me
I desire that one couple and an half of ewes with their
Lambs may be cut or engraven at the Bottom of the
said Gravestone, which stone shall not cost less than
the sum of twenty Guineas, and shall be purchased by
the said Edward Hillbe my Nephew or his heirs and
laid down within the space of twelve Calendar
months next after my decease And in case the said
Edward Hillbe my Nephew or his heirs shall neglect
to purchase and lay down such Gravestone, at such price
and with such Inscription, Augers and Scoops to be cut
or engraven thereon as aforesaid within the space of
twelve Calendar months after my decease then the
Devise to him and his heirs of my said Real Estate
heroby made null, void, and of none Effect to all intents
and purposes And in such case I give and devise the
same with the Appurtenances unto my said Nephew
William Hillbe his heirs and assigns forever And
subject nevertheless to the payment of the several
Legacies aforesaid And I do hereby assign my said
Nephew William Hillbe and his heirs to lay down
such Gravestone, at such price, and with such
Inscription and engraving thereon as is before
directed within six Months next after my decease
as he or they shall see the proportion of his said
by virtue of this my will and in case he and they
shall neglect so to do I hereby declare that the said
Devise to my said Nephew William Hillbe and his
heirs of my said Real Estate as aforesaid shall
be void And in witness hereof I have the Messengers
Bids

Lands & Tenements aforesaid with the Appurtenances subject to the payment of my Legacies as aforesaid and the twenty Guineas for a Grave Stone as before directed unto my good friend Thomas Grigson Esquire his heirs and assigns forever And all the rest and residue of my Goods Chattels and personal Estate (after payment of my just Debts, Legacies, Funeral Expenses, the Expenses of purchasing and laying down a Grave Stone in manner aforesaid, probate of this my Will, and Charges incident to the Execution thereof) I give and bequeath the same and every part thereof to the said Edward Hill my Nephew whom I do make and appoint sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I the said Edward Hill the Testator have to this my last Will and Testament contained in two Sheets of paper, to the first of which I have set my hand, and to this, my hand and seal the

twenty second Day of March in the year of our Lord
