## Edward Filbe of Reymerstone in the

County of Norfolk Execution man thangle somewhat ill  
 indisposed in Body yet of a perfect memory and all  
 understanding and considering the uncertainty of his  
 life <sup>Tree</sup> 36 <sup>9</sup> I do make and publish my last Will and Testaments  
 in manner following First I give and devise all and  
 every my Messuages Lands Tenements and hereditaments  
 whatsoever situated lying and being in <sup>Reymerstone</sup> Reymerstone  
 aforesaid and in Plumpton or elsewhere in the said County  
 of Norfolk as well aforesaid as Copleyhold with their rents  
 and waste of their Appurtenances unto my <sup>1</sup> Nephew  
 Edward Filbe and to his heirs forever charged and charged  
 with the payment of the several Legacies and sums of  
 money hereinafter by me given Also I give and  
 bequeath unto my <sup>2</sup> Nephew William Filbe the  
 sum of one hundred pounds of lawful Money of Great  
 Britain Also I give and bequeath unto my <sup>3</sup> Nephew  
 and Niece John Clark, Francis Clark, Myris Clark  
<sup>4</sup> (6) William Clark, <sup>5</sup> Mary the wife of Alexander paine  
<sup>6</sup> Martha Clark, <sup>7</sup> John Grimmer, <sup>8</sup> Robert Grimmer  
<sup>9</sup> Bridget Raynor widow, and to <sup>10</sup> Jane paine my  
 Cousin (in case she lives with me at my death  
 and not otherwise) and to each and everyone of them  
 the sum of ten pounds apiece of like lawfull Money.  
 All which said several Legacies to his said William  
 Filbe, John Clark, Francis Clark, Myris Clark, Mr  
 William Clark, Mary paine, Martha Clark, John  
 Grimmer, Robert Grimmer, Bridget Raynor, and  
 Jane paine my will and mind is and I do hereby  
 direct that the same shall be paid within the space  
 of twelve <sup>there and</sup> Kalender months next after my decease  
 and to her <sup>the</sup> <sup>and</sup> subject my said Messuages Lands  
 Tenements and hereditaments to and with the payment  
 of all and every the aforesaid Legacies and sums of Money  
 and

will and mind further is that if Default shall happen to  
be made after payment of the said Legacies and sum of  
Money he rembofard directed to be severally paid  
to his said William Gilbo, John Clarke, Francis Clark,  
Myris Clarke, William Clarke, Mary Pain,  
Martha Clarke, John Grimmer, Robert Grimmer, &  
Bridget Raynor and Jane Pain as aforesaid by him  
within of twenty days after his same or any of them  
any part of them shall be recovered and payable by  
virtue of this my will it shall and may be lawful to and  
for his said William Gilbo, John Clarke, Francis Clark,  
Myris Clarke, William Clarke, Mary Pain, Martha  
Clarke, John Grimmer, Robert Grimmer, Bridget Raynor  
and Jane Pain or such of them to whom Default has  
been made to be made out their affixes respectively  
to enter into and upon their several tenements and premises  
aforesaid or any part thereof and the rents issues  
and profits thereof and of every part thereof to have  
recovery and take to his use and their own use and use  
until his death and thereant they may said Legacies and  
every of them shall be fully paid and satisfied by him  
each and every of his said Legacies and sum of Money  
given or directed to be paid to them respectively as  
aforesaid and all the years hereof together with such  
reasonable costs charges and expenses as shall be  
expended in or about the recovery of the said Legacies  
and sum of Money every or any of them or any  
part of the same I do my will and intend is and do  
hereby desire to be buried in the parish church of  
Reynoldsone aforesaid as near to the remains of my  
deceased father as can possibly be and have a large  
and handsome Black marble grave stone laid over  
with

With a proper inscription theron to pre-serve  
our Monuments and two dials engraven or set theron  
at the top thereof and as I when in health used to take  
much pleasure in keeping and looking after my little  
flock of sheep which have been very profitables to me  
I desire that one hundred and an half of them with their  
lands may be cut or engraven at the bottom of the ~  
said gravestone, which stone shall not cost less than  
the sum of twenty Guineas, and shall be purchased by  
the said Edward ffille to my step-father or his heirs and  
laid down within the space of twelve Calendar  
months after my decease and in case the said  
Edward ffille to my step-father or his heirs shall ought  
to purchase and lay down such grave stone, at such price  
and with such inscription, charges and sheep to be cut  
or engraved thereon as aforesaid within the space of  
twelve Kalendas monthes after my decease then he  
desire to him and his heirs of my said Real Estate  
hereby unto him, cold, and of no effect to all intents  
and purposes and in such case I give and devise the  
same with the appurtenances unto my said stepson  
William ffille to me his son and Assignee forever all  
subject nevertheless to the payment of the several  
legacies aforesaid and I do hereby enjoin my said ~  
stepson William ffille and his heirs to lay down  
such a gravestone at such price, and with such an ~  
inscription and engraving thereon as is before  
directed within six months next after settling  
with him shall come into possession of the said appurtenances  
by virtue of this my will and in case he and they  
shall neglect same to be hereby enjoin that the said  
desire to my said stepson William ffille and his ~  
heirs of my said Real Estate as aforesaid shall  
be void and his cause to give him message  
Lands

Lands & Tenements aforesaid with the Appurte-  
nances subject to the payment of my Legacies and  
aforesaid and twenty Guineas for a Gravestone  
as before directed unto my good friend Thomas  
Grignon Esquire his heirs and assigns forever  
and all the rest and residue of my Goods (Furniture  
and personal Estates after payment of my just and  
Dolts, Legacies, Funeral Expenses, the Expenses of  
purchasing and laying down a Gravestone and  
funerall aforesaid, probate of this my Will, and  
Chargos incident to the Execution hereof) I  
give and Bequeath the same and every part thereof  
to the said Edward Field my Neophow witness. Do make  
and appoint sole Executor of this my last Will and an  
Testament. In witness whereof the said Edward  
Field the Testator have to this my last will and Testament  
subtained in two Sheets of paper, to his first of which  
I have set my hand, and to this, my hand and seal the  
Twenty second day of March in the year of our Lord  
22 March 1762  
and seven hundred and Sixty two.
