

IN Obedience to these Presents, That the Board of Filby of Clang
in the County of Norfolk, Senior and Edward Percival
of Waxham in the said County Senior

are fully bound to pay the said Board of Filby of Clang
throughout the County of Norfolk lawfully constituted
in Eight hundred Pounds of good and lawful Money of Great
Britain, to be paid to the said Edward Percival
or his certain Attorney, Executors, Successors or Assigns: To which Payment well and
truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us by himself for the whole, our, and
each of our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, firmly by these Presents, sealed with
our Seals. Dated the 5th Day of November in the Year
of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Eight

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the abovebound Board of Filby
the said Board of Filby of Clang
and Administrators of all and singular the Goods, Rights, Credits and Chattels of William
Filby late of Waxham in the said County and Administrator of
the said Board of Filby of Clang for the said County of
Waxham the Widow and Heirs of the said Deceased

do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the Goods,
Chattels and Credits of the said Deceased, which have, or shall come to the Hands, Posses-
sion or Knowledge of him — the said Edward Percival Filby or into the Hands
and Possession of any Person or Persons for him — and the same to made do
exhibit, or cause to be exhibited, into the Registry of the Court kept for the
said County at or before the next Day of May next ensuing,
AND the said Goods, Chattels and Credits, and all other the Goods, Chattels and Credits

of the said deceased at the Time of his death ^{to be taken} I have in the said Case
to the Hands and Possession of the said Edward Sibby or into the Hands and
Possession of any other Person or Persons for him do well and truly administer
according to Law: And further do make, or cause to be made, a true Account of his
which shall be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and thirty Day of September
(if thereunto lawfully called) and all the rest and residue of the said Goods,
Chattels and Credits, which shall be found remaining upon the said Administration
Account, the same being first examined and allowed
of by the Judge or Judges for the Time being of the said Court, shall deliver and pay
unto such Person or Persons respectively as the said Judge or Judges, by his or their De-
tree or Sentence, (pursuant to the true Intent and Meaning of a late Act of Parliament,
made in the Two and Three and Twentieth Years of the Reign of our late Sovereign Lord
King CHARLES II. Intituled, An Act for the better settling of Intestates Estates) that limit and
appoint: AND if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by
the said Deceased; and the Executor or Executors therein named did exhibit the same into
the said Court, making request to have it allowed, and approved accordingly; if the said
Edward Sibby being thereunto required, do render and deliver
the said Letters of Administration (Approbation of such Testament being first had and
made) in the said Court: Then this Obligation to be void and of none Effect, or else to
remain in full Force and Virtue.
