

THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT OF ME, WILLIAM FILBY

Of St. Peter's Terrace, Hammersmith, in the County of Middlesex, Gentleman.

I desier to be buried in a decent plain manner in a good oak coffin. I direct all my debts, funeral and testamentary expenses be first duly paid.

I give to Isabella filby, the Widow of my late Son Edward filby, now residing in the United States of America, forty pounds sterling money of Great Britain, my said son Edward filby having had the greatest part of his share of my property during my life. I give to each one of my grandchildren Henry filby and Emily filby the children of my late son Miles filby the sum of two hundred ninety two pounds ten shillings each sterling money to be paid to them upon their respectively attaining the full age of twenty one years, then my desier is that the survivor of them shall become entitled in the same such manner and under the same such provisions to all such share of his or her said brother or sister survived as the case may be. And I desier that until the said period shall arrive the Trustee and Executor of this my Will lay out and invest the said respective sums in both cases that is the two grandchildren of the above Miles filby in his and her own name and in the name of both such child respectively within six callendar months after my decease in the three per cents consolidated annuities for the benefit respectively of both of my said grandchildren as above described with full power to my said trustee and executor to pay and apply the dividends and interest thereof to the Widow of my late son Miles filby as long as she remains his Widow, but should she marry again the money to be added to the said estate. My son ffrederic filby having had his full share of my property during my life I leave him one sovereign his brother William may do something for him.

I desier and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my property and leasehold and personal estate whatsoever and wheresoever which may belong to me at my decease unto my son, William filby heirs executors administrators and assigns according to the values and quality thereof respectively to and for his and their exclusive use and benefits constitute my said son William filby sole Executor and trustee of this my last Will and Testament, and I declare and direct that my said son William his executors and administrators shall and may at all times out of the first monies which may come to his or their hands, reimburse himself and themselves respectively, all such costs charges and expenses as he or they may be put to in the execution of the trusts of this my Will and shall not be answerable for any loss that may happen unless the same be through his or their wilful default or ? nor for any loss that may happen through any public Bank or Broker and shall be charge and chargeable respectively for such monies only as he or they shall actually by virtue of the trusts reposed. I hereby revoke all former Wills Codicils and testamentary dispositions by me heretofore made and declare this writing to be my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto put my hand this twenty eighth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and filly five - WILLIAM FILBY
