

Edmund Philbey of Seabrook, Pitstone, 1848

Will of Edmund Philbey of Seabrook in the parish of Pitstone, Bucks.

Bequests:

Wife Ann household furniture and effects and personal estate of every description after payment of my debts by my Exec

Wife Ann the 3 cottages and land at Seabrook and also 2 cottages and allotments at Aston Clinton and any other real estate for her natural life, after her dcd to be divided equally between my five children

Mary wife of John Brooks of Pitstone labourer [bapt 1792.10.14 at Aston Clinton]

Thomas

Elizabeth wife of Thomas Moore of Pitstone blacksmith

Edmund

Henry

And my daughter in law Sarah wife of my dcd son William [bapt 1795.02.15 Aston Clinton]

As tenants in common.

Executor Henry Philbey and Thomas Moore

Feb 28 1848.

Signed Edmund Philbey

Wit: Geo: Lockton Faithfull and Henry Faithfull

Probate to both Exec June 21 1856, died Feb 6 1956.

COMMENT: Buried Pitstone 1856.02.13 age 83. Baptised 1772.10.18 son of John and Elizabeth at Aston Clinton (J&E. Golder were married at Aston Clinton 1767.10.14, see will of John 1818). Married Ann Markham at Aston Clinton 1792.02.16. Children not listed in will, presumably dcd and all baptised at Aston Clinton are

John 1798.10.21

Golder 1801.08.30, buried 1819.01.19 at Aston Clinton, but burial entry states 'of Pitstone'.

Four of the children listed in the will were presumably baptised at Pitstone.

It would seem that Edmund and his family moved to Pitstone sometime after 1801.

In the 1798 P.C. Edmund is listed as a taylor, as was his father John.
