

1765 Filbee Francis Lewknor Will

In the Name of God Amen I Francis
 Filbee the Elder of Moor Court Farm in the parish of Lewknor
 in the County of Oxford Farmer being at this time of
 perfect mind Memory and Understanding Do make and
 declare this to be my Last Will and Testament in manner
 and Form Following (that is to say) First I Give and
 Bequeath unto my son Francis Filbee the sum of two
 Hundred pounds of lawfull money of Great Britain
 to be paid to him within six Months next after my
 Decease by my Executors hereinafter Named I Also
 Give and Bequeath unto my son Richard All my stock
 of Cattle Corn Grain Hay Implements of Husbandry of
 what Nature or kindsoever which are now standing
 Growing lying and being in upon and about the said
 Farm called Moor Court Farm I Also Give and Bequeath
 unto my said son Richard Filbee All and Singular
 my Houshold Goods Except the best Feather Bed two
 Blanketts the best Quilt the bolsters and Pillows with
 the best Feather Bed and two pair of Sheets which I hereby
 order and direct to be deliver'd to my son Francis Filbee
 Immediately after my Decease I Also Give and Bequeath
 unto my Daughter Ann King the sum of twenty pounds of
 lawfull Money of Great Britain to be paid her within six
 Months next after my Decease I Also Give and Bequeath
 unto my Grandson Edward King the sum of twenty pounds
 of lawfull Money of Great Britain to be paid him as soon as
 he shall attain the age of twenty one years by my Executors
 hereinafter named I Also Give and bequeath unto my son
 William Filbee the sum of two Hundred pounds and Fifty
 pounds of lawfull Money of Great Britain And I do hereby
 Nominate Constitute and Appoint my said sons William
 and Richard Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 hereby revoking all Former Wills by me heretofore made
 In Witness whereof I have to this my Last Will
 Francis Filbee and Testament Containd in
 two Sheets of Paper to the First sett my Hand
 and to the last my hand and Seal this sixth
 Day of March in the second year of the reign
 of our Sovereign Lord George ye Third by the Grace of God
 of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender of the
 Faith and so forth and in the year of our Lord One
 Thousand seven Hundred and sixty two Francis
 Filbee (O)
